

1. **Do not throw any material from a moving vehicle, floats, OHV, etc. including CANDY!** Will be strictly enforced and could result in disqualification. Children run out to the vehicle and are exposed to injury. Individuals may walk along the sides of the street to handout items as long as crowd is kept away from moving vehicle.
2. Any motorized vehicle must be operated by a person who is certified to drive the unit. This includes four wheelers, small electric cars, and go-carts. Anyone under the age of 18 must wear a helmet – NO EXCEPTIONS!!
3. Prior to and at the end of the parade, all traffic rules apply, including riding on hoods and on top of vehicles and trailers.
4. All units or marching groups should use routines that do not cause large gaps in the parade procession.
5. All motorized vehicles should have proper registrations if required by law. All motorized vehicles should be insured as dictated by Utah State Law.
6. All operators of parade units will abide by directions given to them by law enforcement personnel.
7. Animals that are part of the parade should be properly cared for and placed in areas where they would not be exposed to loud noises or sudden movements.
8. Fireworks are not permitted on the parade route.
9. Sudden accelerations or stopping of any type of motorized vehicle is not permitted.
10. The first vehicle in the parade will be a marked police vehicle. This is a safety procedure used by the City. If a citizen's vehicle becomes trapped between a block and turns into the parade flow, this police vehicle can clear the parade route.
11. We will try to begin precisely on time. That means that all participants should be lined up and ready to move upon notice. The police vehicle will move onto the parade route and signal all the traffic officers on the parade route that the parade is about to begin.
12. Individuals riding on the floats or vehicles should be seated or standing in such a manner that sudden stops or starts would not be hazardous, especially for small children.
13. Parade concludes at Wellington City Hall at 150 West Main.
